The Board of Commissioners met in a **REGULAR MEETING** with Mayor Santiago presiding. Members present included Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas and Commissioner Cooper. City Solicitor, Brock Russell and Administrator, Regina Burke were also present.

Pastor Brian Wheaton from Gospel Outbound delivered the invocation and led the salute to the flag.

Mayor Santiago made the statement required by the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975

“This meeting is being conducted in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975, was advertised, posted and made available to the public as required by Statute. The Municipal Clerk is directed to include a statement in the minutes of this meeting.”

City Clerk to Review Changes to the Agenda

Mayor Santiago asked if there were any changes to the agenda. Ms. Hitchner stated there was one (1) change to the agenda being:

Resolutions

Minutes

Vice Mayor Parent made a motion to approve to dispense with the reading of the minutes for February 4, 2020 Work Session, Regular Session and Closed Session. Commissioner Pepitone seconded the motion which was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Presentations

Proclamation to be presented to Police Officer Susan Taylor in recognition of her retirement

Police Chief Jody Farabella recognized Susan Taylor for her retirement. He stated that she is the 1st woman to complete 25 years of service from the City of Millville Police Department. Chief Farabella recognized Susan for all of her achievements as an officer.

PAL presented Sue with recognition and honor for her dedication to the PAL program. They presented her with a gift for her retirement.

Dean Inferrera from Action Signs and Awards recognized Sue on her achievement of retirement and also presented her with an award.

Vice Mayor Parent recognized Sue for her work at Lakeside Middle School. He stated that the kids and students love and praise her.

Commissioner Cooper asked Sue to stay for at least four more years. He stated that his daughter raves about her constantly.

Commissioner Udalovas stated that she has witnessed firsthand Sue's work and achievements as a former teacher.

Mayor Santiago applauded her for her achievements and thanked her for her service.

Proclamation designating March 2020 as Youth Art Month

Commissioner Udalovas read the proclamation.

Public Comment on Agenda Items Only

Mayor Santiago stated that this is the time for any Public Comment on Agenda Items Only if anyone wishes to be heard.

Kirk Hewitt of Millville stated he is aware taxes are going up to pay for the City's new EMS services. He compared his Social Security check of \$2,000.00 a month to the amount of taxes he pays per year (\$7,000.00). he stated that it comes out to about \$149.00 a week. He thanked the Commissioners for the new EMS services.

Seeing no one else come forward, Mayor Santiago closed the Public Portion on Agenda Items Only.

Old Business

Mayor Santiago asked City Clerk if there was any Old Business. Ms. Hitchner stated there was no Old Business.

Petitions and Letters

Mayor Santiago asked the City Clerk if there were any Petitions and Letters.

Ms. Hitchner stated there was a Letter of Appointment from Mayor Santiago appointing Doug Hildreth as a regular member of the Shade Tree Commission with a term expiring December 31, 2025.

The correspondence was received and filed on a motion by Commissioner Cooper and seconded by Commissioner Udalovas which was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Ms. Hitchner stated there was correspondence being a Resolution from the Millville Planning Board regarding review of the Ordinance to Repeal and Replace Chapter 30 Land Use and Development Regulations of the City of Millville Municipal Code in its entirety.

Commissioner Udalovas elaborated on the Resolution that was given and gave timeline information.

The correspondence was received and filed on a motion by Commissioner Udalovas and seconded by Commissioner Cooper which was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Reports of Commissioners

Commissioner Cooper

Commissioner Cooper reported on general maintenance being worked on at the soccer complex. He stated that the Department is preparing for spring and summer season. He encouraged citizens to report anything that needs attention.

Commissioner Cooper announced upcoming events. He also encouraged baseball and softball sign-ups with details. He also announced dates for the Holly City Walking Club.

Commissioner Pepitone

Commissioner Pepitone made a motion to receive and file the Police Report for the month of January 2020 and the Fire Report for the month of January 2020. Vice Mayor Parent seconded the motion which was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Commissioner Udalovas

Commissioner Udalovas gave a CDBG update regarding the 1st public hearing scheduled on February 20, 2020. She stated application procedures will be discussed and information provided. Commissioner Udalovas reported deadline for applications for CDBG is February 28, 2020.

Commissioner Udalovas also reported on the revised 1st reading Ordinance regarding Chapter 30 – Land Use which is scheduled for 2nd reading on March 3, 2020. She explained that the 2nd reading might be delayed due to the number of items in need of attention for review from the Planning Board public hearing. She complimented Chairman Bob Gallagher for his leadership in managing the voluminous public comment at their last meeting.

Vice Mayor Parent

Vice Mayor Parent made a motion to receive and file the Tax Collector's Report for the month of January 2020. Commissioner Udalovas seconded the motion which was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Mayor Santiago

Mayor Santiago read the statistics of the Streets and Roads Report prepared by Supervisor Wayne Gressman. He complimented his staff on compliance with the NJDEP. He stated Recycling Coordinator is working on the changes to trash and recycling.

Vice Mayor Parent made a motion to receive and file the Streets and Roads Department for the month of January 2020. Commissioner Pepitone seconded the motion which was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Ordinances on 2nd Reading

City Clerk read Ordinance No. 2-2020 on second reading amending Chapter 43 Parks and Public Property, Article 7 Special Events on Public Lands Subsection 43-36 Definitions. Amending definitions for Alcoholic Beverage Vendor's Permit and definition for Distribution Area.

Mayor Santiago opened the meeting for a public hearing on this ordinance only. Seeing nobody come forward, the public hearing was deemed closed.

Commissioner Cooper made a motion to approve the ordinance on second reading which was seconded by Commissioner Udalovas. The motion was carried by the following vote: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Ordinances on 1st Reading

City Clerk read the following ordinance on first reading:

Vice Mayor Parent made a motion to approve the ordinance on first reading which was seconded by Commissioner Pepitone. The motion carried by the following vote of Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Resolutions

City Clerk read the following resolutions:

Resolution No. 86-2020 authorizing award of bid to Standard Pipe Services, LLC for the project entitled "Sanitary Sewer Rehabilitation Project" in the amount of \$219,060.00 available through Municipal Bond Ordinance No. 36-2019. Vice Mayor Parent moved for the adoption of this resolution, stating he is in receipt of the proper certification of funds. Commissioner Pepitone seconded the motion which was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Resolution No. 87-2020 authorizing First Amendment to professional services contract with Municipal Code Enforcement adopted by Resolution No. 60-2020 on January 21, 2020 Electrical Sub-Code Services for the purpose of increasing amount of contract from \$2,200.00 to \$14,200.00.

Commissioner Udalovas and City Administrator, Regina Burke clarified the need of the amendment to the contract. Commissioner Udalovas moved for the adoption of this resolution, stating she is in receipt of the proper certification of funds. Commissioner Cooper seconded the motion which was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

New Business

Commissioner Cooper moved, seconded by Commissioner Udalovas to authorize the following Special Event on Public Lands Application:

a) 2020 Olympic Day Parade, sponsored by the Millville Board of Education, to be held on May 22, 2020 from 9:30 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. behind City Hall.

The motion was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Vice Mayor Parent moved, seconded by Commissioner Pepitone to authorize the City Clerk to advertise to receive bids for project known as "Columbine Avenue Roadway Improvements" on March 12, 2020, 10:00 a.m., Richard C. McCarthy Commission Chamber, 4th Floor, City Hall.

The motion was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Public Comment

There being no further business, Mayor Santiago stated we have now reached the public comment portion of our meeting. Anyone who would like to address the commission, please go to the podium, state your name, and address your concerns. Please limit your comments to approximately 5 minutes.

Betty Monteleone of Briar Drive, Millville wanted to ask Commissioner Pepitone to call other towns about how they are dealing with their cat problems. Ms. Monteleone stated people owe more on their homes than what the homes are worth and can't pay their taxes. She added that people will be walking away from their homes. Ms. Monteleone asked who wrote the Lane Use Chapter 30 Ordinance that went before the Planning Board. She also asked about the Jim's Lunch status and the wall supports that were placed after the demolition. Ms. Monteleone stated that she feels that if the community doesn't get together then things are not going to change. She stated that the same people make the same bad decisions. Ms. Monteleone said, "Vineland is rich, we're broke."

Cindy Cooke of Val Lane, Millville announced a February 19, 2020 Recovery on Wheels event in Vineland and it will be present in Millville on February 25, 2020. She recognized Shaun Conners from SHINE for her crew of kids that volunteered at Code Blue on Valentine's Day. She spoke of a homeless man that was invited inside their recently held Beef and Beer benefit. She stated that he got to socialize with a Freeholder, have a hot meal and a ride to the homeless shelter. Ms. Cooke stated that she is raising money for an individual who went from homeless status to now holding a job as a counsellor in Missouri after completing the program. She added that they are planning on throwing him a big celebration.

Tamara Syuw of Millville stated that she teaches budgets and finance in a neighboring town. She stated that if the budget exceeds the income then there are things that need to get cut. She encouraged the Commissioners to cut expenses rather than increase taxes. Ms. Syuw stated that you don't have to have it all. She reiterated that the budget shouldn't exceed the income.

Quan Buller with the Holly City Youth Football League thanked the Commissioners and staff for support. Mr. Buller stated that he brought a proposal to the Commissioners which also went to the School Board. Mr. Buller stated that the Holly City Youth Football League is a non-profit organization filled with 1st – 8th graders as football players and cheerleaders. He read a statement about the organization and wants to bring early awareness to the players to be not only great athletes but academic encouragement for the students to do better in the classroom. Mr. Buller gave a breakdown of how they want to approach the organization that is currently 180 kids strong. He stated that they are looking for support from the school district as well.

Natalie Tyson of Sterling Place stated that her thought of the day is "Maturity in life." She stated the key to effective living is to be able to handle pressure. She stated that the true person comes out when you are under pressure. She stated that you must have the attitude to overcome it and remain poised. Ms. Tyson thanked everyone for their contribution to the City of Millville. She encouraged the Commissioners, City workers, the City Attorney stating that it is not easy but prays for strength and wisdom.

Charles Hewitt of Millville stated that the Omni Trax project sounds like it has been in the works for a while. He stated that they are looking for a lease which sounds really good to him. Mr. Hewitt pointed out the way that the meetings are ran in other towns whereas Public Comment is more of a "Questions and Answers" situation and are not as strict as Millville's. He stated that he really enjoyed the Planning Board meeting where comments and questions were more encouraged.

Seeing nobody else come forth, Mayor Santiago deemed the public comments portion closed.

Comments by Commissioners

Commissioner Cooper congratulated Sue Taylor on her retirement. He thanked SHINE kids for helping with Code Blue. Commissioner Cooper stated that he enjoyed Quan's proposals for the kids made to the schools which is outstanding work.

Commissioner Pepitone stated that he called Betty Monteleone a few weeks ago to get 3 cats off of her property and wished she had mentioned that when she spoke earlier.

Commissioner Pepitone recognized Kirk Hewitt for the information regarding his finances which are huge and disheartening.

Commissioner Pepitone addressed Tamara's finance and budget speech on personal finances. He stated the Commissioners want to increase rateables to offset taxes. He added that the Commissioners do not have autonomy over taxes.

Commissioner Udalovas stated that discussions are still very early with Omni Trax. She continued that today's discussion was to see if any departments would have any apprehensions to move forward. She added that this is very much in the preliminary phases. Commissioner Udalovas stated that she is looking forward to seeing it move forward in the City.

Commissioner Udalovas explained that the Chapter 30 Ordinance came from Land Use element of 2017 through a study of Committee members. She explained that Sarah Birdsall, Planner started the Ordinance and was well underway when this Commission took office in 2018. Commissioner Udalovas explained the highlighted areas of the discussion which will change the Ordinance. She stated that the Wawa tract, Laurel Lake overlay, and Union Lake areas were highly discussed. She explained the very specifics of the changes that effect the entire department such as: Zoning Officer and deeming a zoning application complete, etc. Commissioner Udalovas stated that the City Clerk has been patient with the process for such a large item. Commissioner Udalovas stated that on March 9, 2020, the Planning Board will discuss the changes from at the last Planning Board Meeting. She added that she appreciates the feedback and thanked the public for their opinion.

Commissioner Udalovas congratulated Sue Taylor and encouraged more feedback.

Vice Mayor Parent stated that comments are great. He stated that he is looking to address the budget with numbers at these upcoming meetings. He stated that residents should keep in mind that the City has added more firefighters, police officers, and a new EMS Department. He added that with the City being 44 square miles big, that there should be no question that we need more public safety, however, it is going to cost money.

Vice Mayor Parent stated that people are always concerned about having five minutes to speak at meetings. He spoke of how the City is unique with being televised and live on YouTube.


