The Board of Commissioners met in a **REGULAR MEETING** with Mayor Santiago presiding. Members present included Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas and Commissioner Cooper. City Solicitor, Brock Russell, and Administrator, Regina Burke were also present.

Invocation was given by Pastor Jonathan Merki from the Church of Nazarene followed by the salute to the flag.

Mayor Santiago made the statement required by the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975: "This meeting is being conducted in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act of 1975, was advertised, posted and made available to the public as required by Statute. The Municipal Clerk is directed to include a statement in the minutes of this meeting."

City Clerk to Review Changes to the Agenda

Commissioner Cooper

Commissioner Cooper reported that the Parks Department have cut grass on 11 properties in the past two weeks.

Commissioner Cooper also reported the 20th Annual 911 Ceremony was held on September 11, 2021 and he thanked the Millville Fire/EMS Department, Millville Police Department, the speakers and the singers at the event. He stated it was a successful well attended event.

Commissioner Cooper announced the following upcoming projects and events:

- Annual Baby Show (Millville Residents Only Ages 4 and under): September 25, 2021 at Corson Park. Registration 12:00 p.m. and show starts promptly at 1:00 p.m.
- Millville First Annual Hispanic Heritage Day and Parade: September 26, 2021. Begins at 12:00 noon on High Street and Pine Street to High Street and Harrison Street. The festival will be held behind Lakeside Middle School on the football fields from 1:00 to 4:00 p.m.
- The Annual Fishing Tournament: October 23, 2021 at Corson Park. Registration 9:00 a.m. for Ages 5 to 18. Fishing will take place from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. and then lunch will be served afterwards.

Commissioner Cooper announced that Midget League Football has started again and expressed his delight that the scoreboard is working again after not working for 5 years.

Commissioner Pepitone

Commissioner Pepitone stated it was a phenomenal opportunity to witness the community supporting the next generation of football players and support the youth.

Commissioner Pepitone further stated that Commissioner Cooper was being extremely modest when he was talking about the Dog Park and emphasized that it was a perfect celebration.

Commissioner Pepitone read the following press release:

PRESS RELEASE

SEPTEMBER 21, 2021

Director of Public Safety Joseph Pepitone and Chief of Police Jody Farabella have announced that the City of Millville will be observing "Trick-Or-Treat" on Sunday, October 31st - From 4:00PM - 7:00PM, RAIN or SHINE.

Director Pepitone and Chief Farabella remind parents that children should not Trick-Or-Treat alone. They should be escorted by an adult or an older child or should go with A group. Also, children should walk on sidewalks and cross only at the corners, not in the middle of the block. If there are no sidewalks, they should walk on the shoulders, facing any oncoming traffic.

All children should wait until they are at home before eating any treats. This will allow parents to sort and check all items for any irregularities

Also, because the City of Millville is observing Halloween on its traditional date, the Director is asking that residents who wish Trick or Treaters to come to their residence, to turn on their outside porch lights, those who don't, keep their lights off.

Due to COVID19 we encourage all participants to wear face coverings, stay six feet apart if not part of a family unit and to use hand sanitizer often.

Commissioner Udalovas

Commissioner Udalovas read the following prepared statement:

The Department of Public Affairs continues to accept applications from interested tenants applying for the CDBG Rental Assistance Program via the City's website or in paper format made available at City Hall. The program is applied for by tenants demonstrating need of rental assistance as well as necessary documentation, while the payment is disbursed directly to landlords or mortgagors as per requirements of the program. Interested applicants may contact Yazmin Moreno via email or by calling 856-825-7000 extension 7341.

During the Planning Board meeting on Monday, September 13th, topics such as revised fees, and the ordinances pertaining to fences and signs were discussed during the open public comment portion. The Planning Department has advised that the proposed revisions will be provided to the City Solicitor for review with the intent of including the revisions to the existing Chapter 30 as an Ordinance on First Reading on October 5th. The Planning Department seeks to provide a clear schedule of fees for applicants that can be used with an internal guide as proposed through the draft ordinance and drafted by the City's previous Planning Consultant Sarah Birdsall. This guide that adheres to the proposed revisions recommends applicant fees and deposits into escrow according to the components of the application; therefore, the Planning and Engineering Department have recommended adoption of the fees, and revisions to the sections for fences and signs over the next two Commission meetings that will be included in the final draft of the Chapter 30 format as provided by Sarah Birdsall.

The Planning Department is also preparing the next section of the Chapter 30 draft to attach to the October 5th Commissioner's Report that will be discussed with open public comment at the October 13th Planning Board meeting.

Vice-Mayor Parent

Vice-Mayor Parent made a motion to receive and file the Tax Collector's Report for the month of August 2021. Commissioner Pepitone seconded the motion. The motion was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper, and Mayor Santiago.

Vice-Mayor Parent emphasized that it was a great experience once again at the Holly City Midget Football League and expressed his appreciation to the coaches and everyone who attended, such as the County Prosecutor, school teachers, administrators, principals all supporting the youth program.

Mayor Santiago

Mayor Santiago stated he was also happy to see the teachers and administrators in attendance at the Holly City Midget Football League supporting the youth. He stated he attended the 911 Ceremony that day also and stated he witnessed the magic of diversity at each event that day.

Mayor Santiago also praised the successful Dog Park Grand Opening event and the Millville Car Show that were both well attended.

Commissioner Udalovas seconded the motion, which was carried by the following vote: Yeas: Commissioner Pepitone, Vice-Mayor Parent, Commissioner Udalovas, Commissioner Cooper and Mayor Santiago.

Public Comment

There being no further business, Mayor Santiago stated we have now reached the public comment portion of our meeting. Anyone who would like to address the commission, please go to the podium, state your name, and address your concerns. Please limit your comments to approximately 5 minutes.

Cindy Cook addressed the Board of Commissioners and reminded everyone that the Levoy Theatre is back in full swing and stated LeAnn Rimes performed the other night and was a packed house.

Cindy Cook announced that this Friday will be Levoy Theatre's 9th Anniversary and the U.S. Army Jazz Band will be providing a free performance, but it is recommended that anyone who wishes to attend to go to Levoy.net to get tickets.

Cindy Cook also reported on the Homeless Trust Fund Meeting held on September 13, 2021 and wanted to inform everyone that Bridgeton has started a program for tiny homes for the homeless, which are temporary transitional houses, which are 100 square foot and are equipped with heat, air conditioning, mini refrigerator and microwave. She stated there are very strict guidelines and criteria the individuals

must meet in order to be eligible. The homes will be located in a little park in Bridgeton and is called The Village of Hope and for Bridgeton residents only.

Kirk Hewitt addressed the Board of Commissioners and stated the City had the appeal hearing scheduled to held at 4:00 p.m. this afternoon, which has been canceled and rescheduled to be held on October 5, 2021. Mr. Hewitt wanted it on record, because they are on a 95-day timeframe and that he has completed everything that is legally required.

Beth Shaunberger addressed the governing body and stated she has lived on Columbia Avenue for 17 years and has sinkhole in her backyard due to draining issues on Columbia Avenue. Ms. Shaunberger provided the governing body with pictures and asked that they please rectify the matter, because she is concerned about her house and neighbor's houses.

Mayor Santiago asked Ms. Shaunberger to provide the pictures and her phone number and he will someone call her tomorrow.

Seeing nobody else come forth, Mayor Santiago deemed the public comments portion closed.

Comments by Commissioners

Commissioner Cooper

Commissioner Cooper stated the recent community events were successful, because the community and the city worked together and stated that's the theme "Working Together" and he stated that is something the governing body will do for the rest of their term and hopefully moving forward the city will continue to work together. Commissioner Cooper quoted Helen Keller "Alone we can do some things, but together we can do so much more".

Commissioner Cooper stated he did read about the Homeless Trust Fund and stated he would like to consider that program for the City of Millville.

Commissioner Pepitone

Commissioner Pepitone stated when the current Commission started one of their goals was to focus on the community, bring the community out and creating new life in the city and told the governing body job well done and believes they have accomplished that through their term. He further stated that he hopes whoever is fortunate to serve as a member of the governing body after the election that they understand that community involvement is the key to see the city grow and prosper.

Commissioner Pepitone addressed Cindy Cook and expressed his excitement about the homeless program, because it meets so many of the needs in Millville and is really interested in learning more about the program.

Commissioner Udalovas

Commissioner Udalovas expressed her sincere appreciation to everyone who attended the meeting and sharing their concerns.

Vice-Mayor Parent

Vice-Mayor Parent stated he would also like to mention that he rode out to the soccer complex and noted there were many people there and added that the City of Millville has great youth programs such as softball and baseball. Vice-Mayor Parent announced the 50 Year Anniversary of Rob Shannon's Softball Tournament and praised Rob Shannon's dedication, who is one of his closest and dearest friends. He stated Rob Shannon has raised hundreds of thousands of dollars for the youth leagues and expressed his sincere appreciation to Mr. Shannon for all he does for the children and the community.

Mayor Santiago

Mayor Santiago recognized Burt Lopez of Atlantic City Electric for all of his help and support with the dog park. He also extended his sincere appreciation to the Streets and Roads Department, Water Department for their part in getting the dog park up and running.

Adjournment

There being no further comments the meeting was adjourned on a motion by Commissioner Pepitone and seconded by Commissioner Cooper subject to the call of the chair. All were in favor. None were opposed.
